My Aged Care is provided by the Australian Government and helps people to access the right aged care services for their needs.

To be eligible, a person must be: 65 years or older (50 years or older for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people) **There are fees associated with at home, short-term and residential care**

Support at home

CHSP: Commonwealth Home Support Programme

Commonwealth Home Support Programme for entry-level or lower care needs.

HCP: Home Care Packages

Home Care Packages for higher level or complex care needs. There are four levels of HCP with different funding amounts. For information about fees seek advice from My Aged Care.

Care in an aged care home

Short-term care

There are three types of care.

- 1. Respite care short term breaks for participants and carers
- 2. Restorative care help to reverse or slow difficulties with everyday tasks.
- 3. **Transition care** for recovery after a hospital stay.

Residential care

For people who can no longer live at home and need ongoing help with everyday tasks or health care.

To be eligible, you must be:

- Under 65 years old and have a disability or care for someone with a disability, or
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and under 50 years old and have a disability or care for someone with a disability, and
- At risk of losing your independence without support and not accessing similar supports through other programs.

Services available:

- In-home services such as personal care, domestic assistance, and property maintenance.
- Community services including transport, activity groups, food services and respite.
