Ref. Council Budget 2018-19, Council Plan, Strategic Resource Plan, Council Plan forward actions.

The following comment is provided for consideration and response.

This being the third financial year of Rates Capping policy, it is evident that it is working towards the fair advantage of ratepayers. Each Budget is being more carefully prepared, funding availability and costs are allocated more realistically and generally more fairly, which is most important in an urban-rural municipality. The pre-ratecapping process of rampant cost shifting appears to be now reduced and instead a certain amount of government funding is being provided towards the huge costs of our growth corridor municipality. Whether this will continue to work successfully remains to be seen.

The Council Plan forecasts challenges that will result from increasing high population growth and, with the continuing expansion of residential development planned by government bodies for Cardinia Shire, consequent environmental and social costs, plus inevitable pressure of waste removal, drainage maintenance and pollution effects will need increased funding commitment.

Regarding current Budget expenditure, I am interested to know why Corporate Management has been increased from \$3,463,000 to \$4,205,000, and why Child and Family Services has been reduced from \$1,216,000 to \$1,189,000 ?

Also, new projects in the Capital Works program include James Bathe Recreation Reserve \$2.025m, Deep Creek Reserve \$1.865m, Bunyip Soccer Facility \$1.8m, Comely Banks Children's Facility \$2.580m, but Lang Lang Recreation Facility has been allocated \$4.724m, why this urgent priority?

Regarding the currently on trial camera network in the formal Council meeting room, there is common opinion that it is unnecessary, and that its future cost would be far better allocated towards upgrade and improvement of the current Council telephone communication system that is no longer adequate to service the growing increase of incoming calls from the community. The inefficient microphone system installed for Council meetings also requires inspection.

Regarding the very bad condition of a huge number of unsealed rural roads, although dry weather conditions have contributed to their deterioration, it is still a fact that they require more frequent efficient maintenance. Despite its urban growth, Cardinia Shire is still a largely rural municipality, where residents pay their rates and are entitled to have their roads in reasonable condition for safe travel despite varying weather conditions. The state government should be formally advised of this requirement as there is frequent pressure on Council funding for urban priority expenditure.

Re: Tynong Bayles Rd Bayles or Balyes Coralynn Rd

My name is Teena Graham from 440 Tynong Bayles Rd Cora Lynn or 440 Bayles Coralynn Rd Cora Lynn which ever the council refers too.

I am writing about my concerns which I have made the council aware of for the past 8 years or so. The section of road I am referring too is a 3 km stretch from Bayles to Ropers lane. This stretch of road was established while a part of the Casey council many years ago and this is the reason I am told from Cardinia council it is so narrow. For example the road has too bends in the first 1km and on the bends the road surface is only around 2100mm to 2400mm on each side of the white line and these measurements are being generous. The edge of the road is not smooth it actually drops away as the edges are all broken for the whole 3 km.

My concerns are that the road has increased dramatically with local traffic including double boggy trucks, produce and farming trucks and horse floats since the opening of the Pakenham Racecourse at the end of this road. I use this road daily to get my children to and from school and have had numerous broken and chipped windows . If you are passing any vehicle on this stretch of road both cars need to hit the gravel as not to hit each other. When the double boggy trucks hit the gravel the whole truck starts to swing the dirt flies everywhere you can not see the road and this is just an accident waiting to happen.

In winter the gravel section of the road has multiply pot holes which also is very dangerous and damaging my car. Driving of the side of the uneven road continuously into pot holes is also dangerous. This is a major road now not like it was 20 years ago. Koo Wee Rup and the surrounding suburbs are growing and to have a major sporting complex at the end of the road is only going to attract more and more traffic.

To prevent a major accident we are requesting you take the time to consider an up grade of Tynong Bayles Rd to Ropers Lane as stated this is a 3 km stretch. The council have advised that they will only fix damaged roads. We believe this road to be damaged and extremely dangerous.

I have attached 2 pictures taken of a truck just showing you the width and how dangerous it is. This is what we put up with everyday and this is not the double boggys.

~ What's Happening at 4C's ~



MISSION: *Build a pathway that empowers Cardinia Shire residents in time of crisis to move towards a future that holds **HOPE**.*

GOALS:

- *To reduce food insecurity and to provide sufficient food for those in crisis or experiencing hardship within the Shire of Cardinia.*
- *To provide avenues of support and assistance to those who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, sleeping rough or socially or financially disadvantaged.*
- *Provide support to clients who are marginalised, disadvantaged or isolated, those who have been drug or alcohol affected, suffering mental health issues, separated from family and friends with emotional, spiritual, practical support.*
- *Duplicate 'House of Hope' providing further opportunities for those fleeing domestic violence and / or homelessness.*
- *Offer opportunities for Church Engagement by providing opportunities for our Christian Community to 'put their faith into action'.*

OUR STRATEGY:

- *Develop early intervention indicators to identify those at risk prior to people reaching crisis point.*
- *Advocate for affordable housing within our Shire of Cardinia and surrounding areas.*
- *Tackle the hard issue of domestic violence within families and relationships.*
- *Provide resources at a time of need or vulnerability.*

OUR PURPOSE:

*To assist those who are vulnerable and spread **HOPE** across our community.*

OUR VALUES:

BACKGROUND

Drawing on our Christian heritage, our work at 4C's is underpinned by our values.

Influencing the way, we serve and are at the very heart of our service to the community of which we are a part of.

If one of you says to him, "Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it?

James 2:15-17 NIV

4C's – Cardinia Combined Churches Caring Inc. Is a not for profit organisation providing crisis support to those experiencing hardship, crisis or trauma in the Cardinia Shire.

Enabling people to move towards a brighter future.

Historically we have provided food, clothing toiletries and life's essentials to those in need, comfort and compassion in difficult times and **HOPE** to those in our community.

FINACIAL INSECURITY

Financial insecurity in our community creates pressure: having to choose between medication or food or keep the electricity on is a reality within our community. Our activities at 4C's play a key role in assisting and building our community.

We live in one of the richest countries in the world but sadly 14% of our population lives below the poverty line.

Statistics are important when battling disadvantage.

- 1 in 6 children are living below the poverty line.
- On any given night 105,000 Australians are homeless
- 1 in 5 Australians experience Mental Illness every year

Many within our community are battling adversity and experiencing disadvantage every day.

We journey with real people with unique and very often heartbreaking stories.

“After a kidney transplant and currently battling cancer, I have so medications to help me not reject my transplant and others for my cancer treatment, how can I pay for this on top of my living expenses and other bills?”

FOOD INSECURITY

A snap shot from the Foodbank Hunger Report 2017.

- 3.6 million Australians which is 15% have experienced food insecurity in the last 12 months. Of these 3 in 5 experience food insecurity at least once a month.
- Charities are struggling to meet the rising need for Food Relief. There has been a 10% increase in the number of individuals seeking food relief from charities in the past 12 months.
- There are 65,000 people in Australia seeking food relief each month who are unable to be assisted by charities. **(This figure has increased by 20,000 over the past 12 months).**
- Only 37% of charities meet the full needs of the people they assist.

What causes food insecurity?

The high cost of living is the main factor influencing food insecurity in our nation. 56% of people state they have been unable to purchase enough food due to unexpected expenses or large bills.

Top 5 causes of food insecurity:

- 56% - unexpected large bill or expense
- 48% - did not have enough money in the first place – income too low
- 38% - had to pay rent or make mortgage payment
- 35% - food too expensive or person could not afford to buy enough
- 10% - my partner or I got sick or injured and couldn't work.

To get through times of food insecurity, people often go without. 45% of those experiencing food insecurity have skipped a meal. 28% have gone for an entire day without eating.

390,013 kilograms of food was collected for the financial year 2016-2017 to assist those experiencing food insecurity.

From January 2017 until the end of October, 7,577 people have received assistance from our food room of these around half are children. (2 weeks of food as 3 meals a day = 318,234 meals)

“Do I pay this bill or do I buy food for my family”

2 in 5 people (41%) of people who are experiencing Food Insecurity have chosen to not pay a bill to enable them to buy food.

4C's also supports breakfast, and after school programs in schools within our municipality from our surplus goods. These include but not limited to Pakenham Hills Primary School, Minaret College and St. Patricks School. We also assist the Bless Collective food van with fresh produce as we can as those socially isolated access a hot meal in Bourke Park. We also play a key role in assisting other services to provide food for those in need. Windana and Outlook Centre are among these. We assist Food Bank Victoria with fresh produce as we can which in turn assist other agencies to provide for those in need in other regions of Melbourne. We also support Peninsula Care and Restore Food Banks.

Our goal:

- Food insecurity is minimalised for Cardinia Shire residents and beyond*
- To obtain a Refrigerated Food Transport Truck – to enable the transportation of dairy and frozen produce.*

Our Strategy:

- *To assist an additional 10 services with food and toiletries for those experiencing food insecurity*
- *Dairy and Frozen meals transported safely in our Aussie summer*
- *Out of our excess we hope to assist the hidden poor in other municipalities.*

Domestic Violence

The Shire of Cardinia experiences one of the highest incidents of Domestic an /or Family Related Violence. 4C's comes along side and supports many who have been affected by this increasing social issue.

House of Hope *has provided a safe, supportive and caring environment for those fleeing violence within our community.*

Client R was sleeping in her car with her children prior to being housed in House of Hope. After fleeing Domestic violence, Client R slept on the living room floor with her children at an extended family members for a short time, until this option became no longer viable. With a lack of financial resources, it was impossible to acquire rental accommodation and all options for emergency housing had been exhausted.

House of Hope provided an opportunity for Client R and her children to have time for and a safe place to rebuild their lives.

"Having a safe place for my children to be able to play is amazing!"

We have helped many fleeing domestic violence including those who have fled from another state to move to the Cardinia Shire as part of a new beginning for themselves and their children.

A young woman from Western Australia, another from Tasmania, and yet another from rural Victoria are all in the process of integrating into our community after assistance from 4C's.

As we are aware it is not always women who flee from violence. We have assisted a young father with his daughters from interstate who is now working full time in our Shire and his daughters are attending local schools. Many changes have been put in place for the family to feel secure, connected and more importantly safe.

Our goal:

- *is to provide safe and secure housing for those fleeing Domestic Violence. We want to see families flourish as they are supported, loved and have HOPE in their hearts.*
- *5 houses established and operating within the Cardinia Shire housing families fleeing Domestic and /or Family Violence and or homelessness.*
- *Staff, volunteer and community support to assist residents integrate and become healthy participants of our community.*

Homelessness and Rough Sleeping

Homelessness and rough sleeping, is urgent, growing within our Shire and beyond and is a complicated issue.

Homelessness can affect men, women and children. And the homeless come from a wide range of backgrounds.

People don't choose to become homeless. But the problem is often masked, as people experiencing homelessness often move from one temporary solution to another, often making do until the option of permanent accommodation comes up.

Homeless can result due to many factors which include but not limited to: social, economic and health related factors. People may become homeless after experiencing a number of years of poverty, poor relationships, drug, alcohol or mental health issues. It also affects people who have previously been managing well in life until they were dealt a curve ball. Relationship breakdown, death or ill health of a loved one which sets off a chain of events which can result or place a person without somewhere to live.

Homelessness has never been a simple issue and it is becoming more complex in both the profile and the needs of the clients. The network of support services is struggling, but dedicated to helping the homeless back on their feet and keeping them their given the shortage of affordable housing.

*Client M. had no choice about the lack of affordable housing options which led to him living in his broken-down car in the State Forest in the middle of winter with his dog his only companion. Building trust, took time, getting on his feet –even longer. **Hope** was within his grasp and now Client M. is living with his companion in rental accommodation and is beginning to stand on his feet with a network of people encouraging him.*

“You cared enough to give food for my dog. You found firefighters for my fire. You enabled me to be out of the weather, you assisted me get back on my feet.”

Many of our clients pay more than half of their income on rent. This can have them see sawing on the edge of homelessness every month.

Our goal:

- To see a pathway developed that leads away from the cycle of homelessness and rough sleeping.*
- To reduce the impact of the homelessness experience.*

Our Strategy:

- We choose to bring **Hope** into the lives of those in the cycle of homelessness and rough sleeping.*
- Create opportunities that encourage healthy relationship leading to building independent life skills.*

SOCIALLY DISCONNECTED

We often see those who didn't choose to have the mental health issues that are impacting their lives. Choice can be challenging. At times life skills are needing to be developed, support systems to be put into place for the vulnerable which may affect their ability to maintain their lease.

*Client S. sadly experiences mental health issues. Withdrawing from those around him when life gets tough. Recently about to be evicted we were able to engage the assistance of 6 members of a local church to clean and tidy through the house and bring the house into a habitable condition. A young man is mowing Steve's lawn regularly. Healthy meals are being provided. Trust is being built, unconditional acceptance was given and **Hope** is on the horizon.*

"Everything overwhelms me and nobody wants to know me."

*4C's desire is to connect those who are disconnected within our community providing **Hope**.*

Our Goal:

- Establish an outreach activity for the homeless, those sleeping rough and / or those who are socially isolated. Aussie Christmas lunch time B.B.Q.*
- Establish a Single Mum's - Mother's Day Event.*

Our Strategy:

- On the Saturday of Mother's Day weekend to hold a 'celebrating mother's' event for single mum's in our Shire.*
- To engage volunteers to assist with 'celebrating mothers' event. Young adults to serve, Children's workers provide activities for children and Single Mothers loved upon by the support of the wider community.*
- Hold an Aussie Christmas lunch time B.B.Q. With interaction and support from our next generation.*

EXTRAORDINARY VOLUNTEERS

At 4 C's our services are dependent on our incredible volunteers who freely give of their time to impact the lives of those within our Shire. Our volunteers are frequently challenged and stretched as they spend quality time with people they would not normally encounter in their daily life.

Client X for much of life had been homeless. As a child he suffered childhood abuse, and over the years has battled drug and alcohol addiction. Client X had no family or

friends he could trust after moving away from years of criminal association. He was estranged from his ex- partner and Client X was trying to build a relationship with his son.

Client X would often turn up at the centre alcohol or drug affected. Wanting food not for himself but for his son who would be spending the weekend with him. Our volunteers, encouraged him to go to rehab, put healthy boundaries in place with him and helped him to see glimpses of **HOPE**. Client X has now been to rehab, regularly has his son with him and is moving forward in a positive direction.

“There is something different here - everyone here are angels – they accept me – they see good in me – they encourage me – they even taught me healthy boundaries –today I have HOPE.”

OUR GOAL:

- *To build our core team of volunteers with additional ‘strong, young people’ who can work alongside and with our experienced volunteers to ensure the practice of volunteerism continues.*

OUR STRATEGY:

- *Provide opportunities and volunteer positions that offer community engagement and build a social conscious.*

SCHOOLS ENGAGEMENT

Over the past 2 years we have successfully engaged with a number of schools, helping to develop a social conscious within our next generation. These schools have included: Pakenham Secondary College, Beaconhills College and Kambrya College.

Working with the teachers from the Colleges we have highlighted the homelessness issue, food insecurity and issues around Domestic Violence. You will see from some of our photos included in this report, the positive interaction we have had from our next generation who are developing a social conscious.

The students have cooked and prepared meals for the homeless. Raised funds by way of breakfast b.b.q’s at school. Held winter sleep out to highlight issue of sleeping rough to fellow students and the students have played a vital role in

stocking and unpacking our food room from the pallets of goods our drivers have sourced.

Beaconhills College students raised 7,000 plus cans of staple food for our foodroom earlier this year.

OUR GOAL:

- *Teenagers and young people with the Cardinia Shire will be actively engaged in caring and supporting others within the community.*

OUR STRATEGY:

- *'Hand's on' opportunities to be offered to 'kids at risk', schools within and outside of the Shire. Education opportunities to be offered highlighting social issues within the shire.*

4C's in 2018 and Beyond.

Funding for 4C's has previously been reliant on Fundraising efforts with support from the Cardinia Shire for rent for our previous and current premises. We thank the Shire for this generous contribution. A small amount of funding from DSS is received for Emergency Relief Financial Support.

Since the development of 4C's we have relied heavily on the generosity of the community and churches. Donations and Fundraising have been our main source of income. Over the past few years funding has declined yet the need within the community has grown.

4C's has undergone changes in our management and are moving forward with a renewed vibrancy.

Over the years we have had a dedicated core of volunteers who have worked tirelessly to raise funds for 4C's. This has included volunteers from a Church which no longer exists. We have had amazing events which have included:

- *Golf Day*
- *SLOG Bike Ride*
- *Antique Fair*

Unfortunately, the Golf Day is no longer due to the lack of uptake to form an operating Committee as the previous Committee had worked tirelessly to ensure the

event operated smoothly over a number of years. The Committee could no longer commit to this for the future.

The SLOG Bike Ride has operated for 13 years raising in excess of \$350,000 for 4C's. This is to be the final year with this year's event to be held on the 11th November.

The Antique and Collectables Fair has been operating for 14 years, this year's event was held on the 29th July at the Cardinia Cultural Centre. The event is in jeopardy for 2018 due to the refurbishment of the Cardinia Cultural Centre. We are currently looking at alternate venues that can hold the Fair within the Shire.

Issues

- Major Fund-Raising Events have timed out – or about to cease
- Our volunteers are aging and it is difficult to recruit, energetic, vibrant volunteers able to assist for the long term.
- With limited paid staff, time available to establish sustainable fundraising activities. Prepare grant applications, and oversee and respond to the growing need within our community. **4C's needs to source secure funding to continue to operate and serve the community within the Cardinia Shire.**

ACTION

- **4C's is asking Cardinia Shire Council for \$500,000 operating budget to provide sustainable funding for 4C's to continue to operate in 2018 and impact the lives of our community.**
- **Ideally, we request a commitment for 3 years of funding at \$500,000 per year as we source and establish longer term funding options which will include Major Events which will sustain us for the future.**

Currently we are staffed at a minimum with 8 staff only 2 of us are full time – one is a full-time driver. We have over 100 active volunteers, plus an incredible support network who provide generous donations of goods and or of their time or resource. 4C's is looking forward in the past we have managed from one month to the next. We need to secure our future to ensure the vulnerable within the Shire of Cardinia receive the assistance they need.

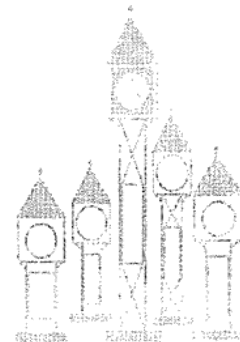
We urge you to include this important upgrade of Koo Wee Rup's main community facility in this planning process.
